

Death of Mrs. Chas. B. Eaton, at Tacoma.

A telegram to relatives in town was received from Tacoma, Wash., last week announcing the dangerous illness of Ida C., wife of Chas. B. Eaton, at her home in that city, and was followed on Thursday by a telegram announcing her death.

Mrs. Eaton was the daughter of the late David L. and Susan Sherwood, and was born and resided in Oxford up to the time of her marriage to Mr. Eaton in 1888, when they removed to Tacoma, where her husband engaged in the practice of law. Mrs. Eaton was a bright and attractive young woman and a general favorite among the companions of her youth. Her early decease is a sad blow to two brothers and two sisters who remain of the family, and to a large circle of relatives and friends in and about Oxford. She was a member of the Congregational church and a member of the society of the "Daughters of the Revolution," her grandfather Sherwood being a revolutionary soldier. Her age was 39 years and the cause of her death was pneumonia.

The bereaved husband, who is on the way with the body for interment, and is left with the care of four young children, will receive the heartfelt sympathy of his former townsmen. The body is expected to arrive here on Saturday, when arrangements for the funeral will be announced.
